It is hard to believe a year has passed since I became Executive Director of Genesis House. I quickly found that I have a very strong team of dedicated employees and volunteers that are true to our mission. They work hard to ensure the needs of the people are being met to the highest quality of care that can be achieved. I am blessed to be surrounded by folks that really care about what they do. With such wonderful support from the community, the volunteer program has grown, funding has increased, and services for people who are homeless have expanded.

Since opening our doors in 1995, over 500 families have resided at Genesis House, thanks to the labors of wonderful people such as you. Last year over 40 families were aided in the Aftercare Program which helps families stay strong and independent after they leave Genesis House. Many other families who called for help were also assisted so they did not lose their housing and did not need to move into Genesis House. We love being able to help prevent homelessness. That's the best thing we can do!

That's why we are starting a new program called HelpNet, to help support pastors. Genesis House will help provide faith-based confidential case management. Today our goals include increasing public awareness, and our volunteer program; diversifying our funding resources; and further developing our medical and mental health services to stabilize the health of our families. We are one of the very first rural homeless shelters to provide medical services to our residents who do not have insurance.

Genesis House is a very special place for new beginnings, and it could not happen if people like you did not support us as your local mission.

Your continued support is needed to assist us in providing a home for the homeless. We ask for your continued daily prayers for the families of Genesis House and all our caring volunteers and staff. With your valued partnership, we can offer countless hopes for a fresh start.

HOPE BROUGHT FROM DC CENTRAL KITCHEN SPEAKER

In July, the executive director of the DC Central Kitchen, Michael F. Curtin Jr., spoke at the luncheon hosted by the Genesis House to support Homeless Awareness Day.

Mr. Curtin explained that “hunger is not all about food” and neither is “poverty all about money.” He credits the success of the DCCK to the culinary skill program taught. The program helps to give those who are homeless some of the skills they need and also helps to empower them.

The DCCK, with Curtin’s experience in hospitality and restaurants, takes in unused food and turns the leftovers into healthy meals. The meals are then sent to non-profit services to distribute among the homeless.

At the Genesis House, we too are taking steps toward feeding the local homeless people. With food donated, we are putting together healthy soup packets, which are easy to make and provide healthy, convenient and nutritional meal choices.

They provide help with food, transportation, finding housing, medical needs, parent education, job referral and budgeting. Aftercare begins the day people enter Genesis House.

WELCOME DR. KALSMAN

When families come to Genesis House many are facing health issues that need attention. Thanks to Dr. Michael Kalsman our prayers have been answered. Dr. Kalsman is the Medical Director of Southern Tier Community Health Center Network and has generously donated his day-off every week to help care for the families at Genesis House. No rural homeless shelters have a physician onboard to help families to get their lives back in order.

Dr. Kalsman is a graduate of the University of Arizona College of Medicine and completed his residency at the University of Utah Department of Family and Community Medicine. He is board certified in Family Practice and received the 2002 AAFP Foundation Practice Based Research Network Research Stimulation Grant. He is a diplomat of the American Board of Family Practice and a member of the American Academy of Family Physicians, Society of Teachers of Family Medicine and National Rural Health Association.

Many who are homeless go years without receiving any medical attention, which often results in life-threatening health problems. Dr. Kalsman's concern for treating the homeless is caring, conscience and inspiring.

Dr. Kalsman stated, "The average life expectancy of a person that is homeless is 45, compared to the national average of 77. The goal of our practice at University Primary Care has always been for the underserved. This program is another avenue to achieving our mission. My hope is to eventually be able to be able to provide basic service to all those that are homeless in the Olean/Salamanca areas."
